8:00-11:30 Caravan leaves hotel Whitewater River Gorge, Richmond, In Kevin Strunk, Wabash Resources and Consulting, Inc.

We will visit several locations in the immediate Richmond area which highlight the unique glacial and bedrock geology and the origin of the Whitewater Gorge, as well as view the related terraces and the gravel deposits. The Whitewater Gorge is a unique feature formed by the successive channeling of massive amounts of glacial meltwater in multiple episodes resulting in a 4-mile long bedrock gorge cut 60-80 feet deep and several hundred feet wide. The gorge has a resulting complex history. We will start at the north end where two main meltwater channels merge to begin the gorge, then make stops at prominent points within the gorge, taking advantage of the Whitewater Gorge Nature Trail access points. Stops may include Thistlewaite Falls, which shows the waterfall retreat mechanism of gorge formation, stops to see the vertical bedrock cliffs of the gorge perhaps at "Happy Hollow", see the "Weir Dam" and then viewing the unique remnant and bedrock and gravel terraces, old mill site and the scenic river valley near the Test Road Bridge, with a final stop at the excellent gravel and till exposures at the Stonehenge Gravel Company pit on the south end of the gorge. At Stonehenge we will be able to see a 70' tall exposure of massive cross-bedded outwash capped with a late Wisconsinan till that is being actively mined in a scenic and still rural portion of the valley and gorge.
