### **Symposium Overview**

The 39<sup>th</sup> Annual IWRA Spring Symposium will be held June 27-28 at the Monroe Convention Center in Bloomington, Indiana. The theme of the symposium is ***“Ensuring a Sustainable Water Future for Indiana.”*** How will water quantity, use, infrastructure, and quality affect water availability into the future?

The final day of the annual meeting, Friday, June 29, will be a water-resources tools and techniques demonstration day held at Flatwoods Park, Gosport, Indiana. Flatwoods Park is just a short drive northwest of Bloomington, Indiana. More information will follow regarding a call for participants to demonstrate their favorite and effective field tools and techniques to their colleagues.

For the 2018 symposium, we are seeking oral and poster presentations on a wide range of topics related to water sustainability including: **Water Supply:** Aquifer storage, understanding or planning for extreme events (droughts, flooding), surface-water and groundwater resources, water-resources planning. **Water Quality:** Point and non-point source contamination and how that can unexpectedly result in water scarcity concerns. **Infrastructure:** Public water supply, treatment, distribution, mapping. **Habitat:** How do low flows, sedimentation, or contamination affect in-stream species. In addition to these “theme” topics, we would love to hear about water-resource issues and activities in *your* area of expertise.

IWRA is particularly effective in bringing together professionals and students from a variety of water resources and related disciplines and provides a relaxed forum for presentation and discussion. To that end, ***presentations on any topic concerning water resources research, assessment, planning, management, protection, development, or education are solicited.*** Student presentations are particularly encouraged and students receive financial support to present (see Student Scholarships). The cost of presenting will be covered by the IWRA Student Scholarship Fund. Presentations are not required to be original material, and ***we welcome presentations given previously to other organizations.***

### **Abstract Submission**

Abstracts should be submitted via email to Sally Letsinger (sletsing@indiana.edu). Please use the subject line “2018 IWRA Abstract.” Abstracts should be in Microsoft Word or Adobe Portable Document formats, should not exceed one page, and should include:

- A description of the issue or problem, the methods or approach, results, and implications for water-resources research or management.
- The title, author(s), and affiliations. Please include contact information (email and telephone) for the presenting author. Please indicate if the presenting author is a student.

**The deadline for submitting an abstract is May 18, 2018.**

### Symposium Registration Fees

**All non-student presenters are expected to pay the symposium registration fee.** If your employing organization cannot or will not pay the registration fee, please contact Sally and we'll try to work something out. Registration fees have not yet been determined but are expected to be approximately \$130 and include two meals. Information on registration fees, lodging, and other details will be provided in early May in the symposium announcement and at the IWRA web site <http://iwra.info>. Students are eligible for a reduced registration fee. Student presenters will have their registration fees paid by IWRA.

### Student Scholarships:

IWRA especially values student presentations and sponsors a Student Scholarship Fund designed to cover student expenses for attending and presenting at the Spring Symposium. All student-submitted abstracts will be considered for a scholarship.
